Grease Audition Dates Are Set

Auditions for SLOC's fourth production of the season, *Grease*, are scheduled for January 25 and 27. Sign-in will be at 7:00 pm at the Opera House. The show will be directed by Matthew T. Teichner and produced by Brett Putnam, with Dave Cash as Musical Director and Joanne Lapitsky as Choreographer. Performances are set for May 6, 7, 8, 12, 13, 14, and 15, and rehearsals will begin in February, specific date to be announced.

Auditioners should prepare at least 16 bars of any Broadway song. Please bring

your own sheet music. Music on hand for those who come unprepared will be extremely limited. A capella or self-accompanied auditions are discouraged. Approximate vocal ranges are listed for each character below.

There will be readings of selected scenes, and a movement/dance audition. [Dancing in the show involves 1950's jazz styles.] Actors may be taught a brief selection and dance number from the show. Dress appropriately.

It all started in 1972 when a friend, Jean Louis, sold her a ticket to *Jacques Brel is Alive and Well and Living in Paris*. Della and her husband, Ira, went to see this SLOC production together. Della noticed that Ira was singing along with the show in the audience and asked him, "What are you doing here? You should be up there!". Ira auditioned for the next show, *Annie Get Your Gun*, and the couple's entry into SLOC history was born. Della's first responsibility came when Jean Clarke asked her to do tickets for a production at Niskayuna High School. Della has had many responsibilities since that time including Secretary to the Board of Directors and VP of Audience Services. A lot of the friends that Della has made over the years have been a result of SLOC. Her daughter, Jodi, and son, Jeff, have been raised around Light Opera productions. It seems that Jodi is now following in her parents' footsteps. Della and Ira received the Etta Moore

Award in 2001. One of Della's recent contributions to SLOC has been her support for the ALD system for the hearing impaired. She will be doing tickets for *Grease* this spring. Even though you will not find Della herself on stage, there has been one Gilman gracing the SLOC boards this season - her dog, Sample, who assumed the role of "Chowsie" in our most recent production, *Gypsy*.

- * *Triumph of Love* was adapted from Pierre Marivaux's 1732 French comedy *The Triumph of Love*.
- *It is considered to be in the style of commedia dell'arte, which is a type of comedy popular in the Italian theaters in the 16th to 18th centuries. The style relies heavily on improvisation and expressive physical comedy.
- *The original Broadway cast included Susan Egan, Betty Buckley, F. Murray Abraham, and Roger Bart, before he found fame in *The Producers*.
- *According to New York theater critic Clive Barnes, *Triumph of Love* has the best closing line he remembers in musical theater. No, we're not telling you what it is...come hear it for yourself!

The plot revolves primarily around the attraction between greaser Danny Zuko and the virtuous Sandy Dumbrowski. Casting requirements call for eight women, nine men, and a chorus.

Women:

Sandy Dumbrowski - Soprano (low A to high B); Part Size: Lead; Dancing: Medium Difficulty; Age Range: 17 - 24; Character Description: The attractive, new, wholesome, and innocent girl in town.

Marty - Mezzo Soprano (low C to Db); Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 16 - 22; Character Description: Immature but most attractive member of the Pink Ladies gang.

Frenchy - Mezzo [F# to B]; Part Size: Supporting; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 17 - 25; Character Description: A Pink Lady who eventually drops out of school to enter Beauty School. She is extremely attentive to her appearance, well meaning, and an airhead

Jan - Mezzo Soprano (F to C#); Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 16 - 22; Character Description: Loud and overweight member of the Pink Ladies gang.

Betty Rizzo - Soprano (A to high C); Part Size: Supporting; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 18 - 25; Character Description: The tough and sarcastic leader of the Pink Ladies.

Cha-Cha - Soprano (low B to G); Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Intense; Age Range: 18 - 25; Character Description: A great dancer who is also loud-mouthed.

Patty Honeywell - N/A; Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 16 - 20; Character Description: A typical, attractive, confident cheerleader.

Miss Lynch - N/A; Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: N/A; Age Range: 40 - 60; Character Description: A grumpy English teacher.

Pink Ladies - N/A; Part Size: Chorus; Dancing: Intense; Age Range: 16 - 25; Character Descriptions: Teen gang members.

Men:

Danny Zuko - Tenor (low Eb to high B); Part Size: Lead; Dancing: Medium Difficulty; Age Range: 18 - 25; Character Description: The macho, handsome leader of the Burger Palace Boys.

Roger - Tenor (low A to high A); Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium to Intense; Age Range: 17 - 25; Character Description: A jolly member of the Burger Palace Boys who enjoys 'mooning' people.

Kenickie - Baritone (low A to high F#); Part Size: Supporting; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 18 - 25; Character Description: A tough member of the Burger Palace Boys and a car fanatic.

Sonny - Baritone (G to C); Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 16 - 22; Character Description: A big-talking member of the Burger Palace Boys.

Doody - Tenor (E to high E); Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium; Age Range: 16 - 20; Character Description: The youngest member of the Burger Palace Boys who worships the older members.

Johnny Casino - Baritone [G to E]; Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: N/A; Age Range: 16 - 22; Character Description: A student at Rydell High School who leads a rock 'n' roll band.

Teen Angel - Tenor [E to high E]; Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: N/A; Age Range: 27 - 35; Character Description: An extremely attractive singer.

Eugene Florczyk - N/A; Part Size: Cameo; Dancing: Medium to intense; Age Range: 16 - 22; Character Description: A pompous but gullible nerd.
