

The correspondence and events that follow affect the lives of these two lonely people as well as their friends, relatives, and neighbors.



In 1925 the Pulitzer Prize for Drama was awarded to Sidney Howard for *They Knew What They Wanted*, first produced in 1924 at the Garrick Theater in New York City. Some thirty years later Frank Loesser, composer-librettist, drew upon this prize winning production for his successful musical adaptation, *The Most Happy Fella*, revived last Spring at the New York City Center.






Who's Who in the Cast

FRED K. LYNGARD (Tony)—played the role of Freddy in the SLOC production of My Fair Lady. With the Triune Musical Company he appeared in Guys and Dolls and conducted Red Mill. Fred, who has co-written two junior high school musicals, directs a church choir in Colonie, sings at a Temple in Albany, and teaches music in the Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake Central School District. A graduate of the Crane School of Music, Potsdam, he is also studying there for his Masters Degree.

Honey Berry Templeton (Rosabella)—is singing in her fourth SLOC production, having played major roles in Amelia Goes to the Ball, Oklahoma! and Where's Charlie? She has studied with the American Theatre Wing in New York City, and has appeared in Albany Light Opera Company and Saratoga Spa Theatre productions. Honey is associated with the Monday Musical Club of Albany and is soloist at the Third Reformed Church in Albany.

Connie Manning Holzer (Cleo) — is playing her first major role with SLOC. She has previously served on several production committees and as a member of the chorus. Connie appears regularly on WRGB's Earl Pudney Show. She has performed on TV and in clubs in New York and Boston. Connie, studied at Emerson College and the Boston Museum School of Art and was vocalist with the Les Elgart Orchestra. She designed the poster for this production.

Robert Boggs (Herman)—is appearing in his fifth major role for SLOC having played in Showboat, Finnian's Rainbow, Oklahoma! and Where's Charlie? As director, his credits include My Fair Lady, The King and I, The Music Man and The Merry Widow. Bob has also appeared in and directed numerous productions at the Civic Playhouse. A graduate of Southern Methodist University, he is with Audio Communications at the General Electric Company.

Howard Moyer (Joe)—also appeared in the SLOC production of Kiss Me Kate. As an undergraduate at Cortland State University, he was in several of the Cortland Player's productions. A science teacher at Central Park Junior High School, Howard holds a Masters Degree from Union College.

SCHOLARSHIPS



Each year, the Schenectady Light Opera awards scholarships for study in two musical fields. Separate public auditions are held with qualified judges who are residents of the area.

A \$100 Light Opera Scholarship is offered for study of voice drama or dance. Judging is based on vocal ability, style, interpretation and stage presence. This years winner was Miss Gail Campbell of Scotia.

Two Classical Vocal Scholarships of \$200 and \$100 are offered for classical vocal study. Judging is based on vocal ability and poise. This years awards were presented to Miss Cheryl Rickman of Albany and Miss Mary Ann Dievendorf of Canajoharie. Richard Fragomeni of Schenectady received honorable mention.


