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#### "FINIAN'S RAINBOW"

### The Story

Produced on Jan. 10, 1947 at the 46th St. Theatre, "Finian's Rainbow" was an instant hit. It brought David Wayne to stardom and Michael Kidd to fame as a choreographer.

When Irish Leprechauns and their pots of gold get mixed up with poor Southern tobacco sharecroppers, civil rights and Shears and Robust, one can expect an entertainment quite out of the ordinary. The story tells how Finian McLonergan has stolen a pot of gold with its three built-in wishes from the Leprechauns of Glocca Morra, and accompanied by his daughter, Sharon, has brought it to America intending to bury it near Fort Knox on the theory that gold so planted will multiply.

He acquires a strip of land in the mythical state of Missitucky just as it is about to be sold for taxes, thereby preventing the rapacious and bigoted Senator Rawkins from acquiring ownership of the whole valley and dispossessing the sharecroppers; (and at the same time encourages a romance between Sharon and Woody, the young owner of the property.)

However all is not smooth sailing for Finian. Og, the Leprechaun, had followed him from Ireland, guided by the magnetic feathers on his cap which point the way to the culprit. Og is worried because the loss of the crock is causing all the leprechauns to become gradually mortal.

The buried crock brings about unexpected disasters when people unknowingly stand over its burial place and make wishes. Then when Finian needs the crock most, to his consternation he finds it has been stolen. Susan, Woody's deaf-mute sister, unwittingly adds to the complications. Then when things look their very blackest, the pot turns up again in a most delightful manner. Susan's first kiss completes the Leprechaun's transformation to a mortal, the Senator turns into a kindly benefactor, Sharon and Woody are united, and Finian follows his Rainbow to Oak Ridge, Tennessee to conquer new worlds.
