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
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A Letter From The President

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A Letter From The Director

It's been my privilege to be part of the SLOC community since 2009. I am a choreographer by trade, preferring to tell stories through movement and dance. This year, however, with some encouragement from my dearest theater friends, I thought I'd tackle directing, diving in with one of my favorites, *Jesus Christ Superstar*. My mom introduced me to the original film years ago and, although that's a bit of a trip, the songs and energy of the movie were unforgettable.



Regardless of your religious affiliation, you're probably familiar with the story of Jesus of Nazareth, a figure of grace, goodness and charity spreading the word of God. That story is, of course, the basis for Andrew Lloyd Webber's rock opera. What makes this telling unique is its perspective. Told from the point of view of Judas Iscariot, Jesus' right-hand man, the audience is given a different picture of the final days of Christ.

As a director, it can be challenging to present a well-known narrative in a fresh, new light. However, in our modern world, with our political climate in its current state, I thought this was a good opportunity to bring this musical into the present time. With its undertones of fear, violence, and political corruptness, *Superstar* can be viewed as something of a cautionary tale of allowing fear to rule our decisions and not following our ethical compass. However, the greater themes to come out of *Superstar* are of hope, kindness, friendship, and forgiveness. These are such basic human concepts but sometimes we need a reminder of how critical they are to our everyday lives.

This production was only made possible by the incredible talent of the cast and the hard-working production team members I have surrounded myself with. A very special thank you to Matthew, Jill, Michael, Adrienne, Melissa, and Emily for being so supportive and providing me with the knowledge I needed to be as successful as I could be. Without their guidance, this would not be the stellar production that it is.

Please continue to support Schenectady Light Opera Company so that we can continue to provide you with high quality theater every season. Thank you for joining us tonight to share in this modern telling of a classic rock opera. We hope you enjoy the show!
