### A Letter From The Director

I have been fortunate in the last three season's at SLOC to have been allowed the opportunity to bring to life a wide variety of musical styles. 2011's production of *Les Miserables* was an example of epic, large scale musical theater, with a soaring musical score and a book backed by Victor Hugo's legendary novel. In early 2012, I directed *BABY*, a musical as far away from *Les Miserables* as you can get. Unknown to most of the Capital District, *BABY* was a more intimate musical that's main focus was it's characters, bringing audiences into the hearts and lives of three couples about to have a baby. In December 2012, *Little Shop Of Horrors* was a whimsical romp into a



science fiction, B Movie-style favorite about a man-eating plant desiring world domination. This year, I wanted to go back to the basics and spend some time working on the musical genre that served as my learning ground when I was a kid growing up in the theater.

My original choice was *Oklahoma*; however, it wasn't long after we announced the production that we learned the rights to produce the show were frozen, due to another production occurring in the Berkshires. When selecting a replacement, I knew that I must choose a show that was not only near and dear to my heart, but one that would be near and dear to the hearts of our audience members. There was one obvious choice. It is an honor to be opening the Schenectady Light Opera Company's 2013-2014 season with this production of *Guys And Dolls!* This is, in particular, a very special honor, as this production marks SLOC's 50th Anniversary of the show, having premiered it in 1963. SLOC has had two other productions, as well, in 1978 and 1997.

My desire to go back to the classics was not only to give me an opportunity to return to where I cut my teeth in the theater, but also to give SLOC's audiences what they seem to really enjoy, classis musical theater. On the artistic side, it gives my actors excellent, well developed roles, that are a simply a joy to perform. *Guys And Dolls*, with characters by Damon Runyon, has been called "A love letter to Broadway," and is one of a class of musicals, like *Oklahoma*, that from 1940 to 1966, sat in perfect equilibrium with the appetite of the audience, the talent of the performers and the taste of the time. It was a form of theatre that, uniquely, could be said to have crossed class barriers. Shows such as these are supreme examples of dramatic art and address the emotional experience of an audience directly and without inhibition. In this, they're peculiarly American — without irony and cynicism and full of willful optimism. Many have named *Guys And Dolls* the best of these shows, the wittiest, the most joyous and the most devoid of being excessively sentimental. The timing in bringing this production to SLOC couldn't be more perfect.






