We are all tremendously excited about the season. We hope you are too. And we also hope that you will consider becoming Special Member or Season Ticket Subscribers for next year. In addition to the support it gives to us, it also assures you first choice of tickets.

Once again, thank you for helping us to have a record breaking season. We in SLOC put in a lot of effort toward making it successful, but it is you who made the effort worthwhile. See you at the Concert in June, and next fall, as we work to make next year even better than this one.

Who's Who in the Cast

Sylvia Horwitz, Golde, has graced the SLOC stage many times, most recently in Oliver, and is the current Vice President of SLOC Artistic Operations. She has performed at the Schenectady Civic Players and was last seen there in Little Mary Sunshine. Sylvia, a graduate of the University of Maine, is

active with the Etude Club and AAUW Music for Performers.

Pamela Wild Marsen, Tzeitel, a newcomer to Schenectady and SLOC, is no newcomer to the world of theater. Hailing from New Orleans, she received her BA in Theater from Sophie Newcomb College of Tulane University and in 1971 was awarded a Master of Fine Arts in Acting from Columbia University. Pam has studied acting with Joseph Papp of the American Shakespeare Festival and acted with the Repertory and Summer Lyric Theaters of New Orleans. She had the lead in a GE promotional film shown at the US Pavilion of Tokyo Expo.
