

The Story

La Perichole and her lover, Paquillo, street singers in mythical Peru, are so poor that they cannot afford a marriage license. The Viceroy, smitten with Perichole's charms, invites her to become a "lady-in-waiting" in the palace. She acquiesces and regretfully writes Paquillo a farewell letter. Since only a married woman is qualified to live in the palace, the Viceroy commands that a husband be found for her, and the search results in Paquillo who is driven to distraction by Perichole's letter. Wine and promises of money finally get him to consent to marry an unknown woman. Perichole is also very inebriated when the ceremony takes place. She, however, consents only when she sees whom she will wed.

In Act II Paquillo, now Baron of Tobago and Marquis of Manzanares, is to formally present his wife to the Viceroy. When he finds that he has been duped and that his Perichole is to become the Viceroy's mistress, he flies into a rage and is consigned to the "Dungeon for Recalcitrant Husbands".

Perichole visits Paquillo, bringing a bag of jewels with which to bribe the jailer who turns out to be the Viceroy in disguise. The two lovers are fettered at opposite sides of the cell. At that moment an old prisoner bores through the wall with his little penknife and helps them to escape.

Back in the Public Square the people are recounting the escape. The Viceroy is furious and orders that the prisoners be found at all cost. Perichole comes forward to ask the Viceroy's forgiveness, and he, touched by their devotion for each other, pardons them and confirms their new titles.

Jacques Offenbach composed "La Perichole" in 1868 at the height of his career. Music for the show was so popular that themes from several numbers in the score were incorporated in the "Gaite Parisienne" ballet. Original libretto was by Meilhac and Halevy, who were responsible for the lyrics in "Carmen". The Metropolitan Opera Company commissioned Maurice Valency to adapt the show with English text, and "La Perichole" was first performed in this new version by the Met on December 23, 1956, having since proven a popular addition to the repertoire.
