The Music Man

Story and Background

The Music Man is a valentine — a musical valentine. It is sweet, hopelessly sentimental, corny — and above all a sincere tribute to an era and a place. Meredith Willson put all his boyhood memories of Mason City, Iowa, into one package and presented them with all his love.

River City — surely Willson's Mason City — is the ultimate in 1912 small towns. Its citizens are more typical than anyone you'll ever meet, and the events that occur there are right out of the pages of everyones memory.

Harold Hill — a dazzling, travelling con man — arrives in River City intent on selling the citizens all the accourtements of a fine boys' marching band: instruments, instruction books, and uniforms. While there he attempts to establish an especial rapport with the local piano teacher and librarian — a rather prim and misunderstood young lady, Marion Paroo. He also establishes a Committee on the Classic Dance, a barber-shop quartet, ice-cream sociables, everything — everything that is but a boys' band.

How Professor Hill (as he prefers to be known) overcomes his complete musical ignorance by a revolutionary new musical concept, and how he overcomes the doubts of certain local citizens and the disinterest of typical Miss Paroo are the elements of suspense we would not wish to spoil or divulge.

We can only say that a story about typical small-town America and typical small-town American people of 1912, ends with a typical happy ending. After all, this is musical *comedy*.
