


The Order of the Little Sisters of Hoboken was founded in the seventh century by Saint Wilfrid, a bishop of England. He established the first convent and school known as the Wilfrid Academy. His motto was "We don't teach beauty --we radiate it!" Many years later a small group of pioneering sisters set out for America to establish a motherhouse in Cleveland. But they got off the plane in Newark by mistake. The order was "found" by the Newark Airport Police and the new motherhouse was established in Hoboken, New Jersey. It was at that time that the Order of St. Wilfrid elected to change the name to the Little Sisters of Hoboken, and they have been affectionately known as the "Little Hobos" ever since. It was from this convent that Sister Mary Cardelia, Sister Mary Hubert and Sister Robert Anne set sail for the Mediterranean to establish their leper colony. Today the order has both nuns and brothers as members--all doing various good works in the Diocese of Newark. They also operate Mount Saint Helen's School in Hoboken.



WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

▶ BONNIE WILLIAMS (Sister Mary Cardelia, the Mother Superior) made her first SLOC debut 15 years ago this week! She last appeared in the Gala Benefit Concert in 1994. Other SLOC shows include Cinderella, Oklahoma, Music Man, Oliver and H.M.S. Pinafore (Buttercup). She has also appeared in Family Players' summer productions of Oklahoma and Music Man, and in Schenectady Civic's Lend Me a Tenor.

▶ PAUL GINDER (Sister Hubert) is performing for the third time at SLOC. She was in SLOC's Gala Benefit Concert and last spring played Miss Jones (dancing on the desk) in How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying. Paula has appeared in area productions as Princess Puffer in Mystery of Edwin Drood (RPI), Mother Superior in Nunsense (ARIA) and Nunsense II (Family Players), Mother in Getting Out (ACT), Sister in Orpheus Descending (SCT), and many more.




**D**ORLANDO PIGLIAVENTO (Director/Choreographer) has been active in area dance and community theater for more than 30 years and has directed 12 shows for SLOC, including Peter Pan, Annie, West Side Story and Gypsy. He has choreographed more than seven musicals, including Music Man. Mame, She Loves Me and Guys & Dolls. Orlando has performed in Oklahoma. Music Man, Curly McDimple and played George M. Cohan in George M. A retired teacher for the Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake Central School system, he is co-owner, with his wife Eleaner, of the Orlando School of Dance. A graduate of Siena College and SUNY-Oneonta, Orlando directed the Proctor's Christmas Show for several years. With his wife Eleaner, they were the founding choreographers for the Proctor's precision dance ensemble, the Off-Broadway Babies.

**BEA McTIGHE** (Musical Director) came to the Capital District from Queens

a year and a half ago and made her Albany theater debut as pianist/arranger/ singer in Those Were the Days, a vaudeville act for "First Night 1993." For many years in Oueens, she was musical director of the Gingerbread Players, a community musical comedy theater group. From 1978-1993, she was musical director/arranger/accompanist(sometimes singer) for an annual musical revue sponsored by the Forest Hills Women's Club. When they let her out from behind the keyboard, she tripped the boards in Under Milkwood. The Cocktail Party and did scenes from Sweet Charity, to name a few.
