



SLOC'S 79TH SEASON


Schenectady Light Opera Company is pleased to announce our 79th season. Our first production of the season will be <u>Songs for a New World</u>, by Jason Robert Brown. It is presented in cabaret style at the Opera House. "It's about that moment when you're on the verge of success, and the sky starts to change and the wind starts to blow. You are now in a completely different land. You are in A New World."

Our second production of the season is <u>Nuncrackers</u>. This Nunsense Christmas Musical takes place in real time in the basement of Mount Saint Helen's Convent. It is the first TV special being taped in the Cable Access Studio built by Reverend Mother with part of the prize money won earlier by sister Mary Paul/Amnesia. An original ballet based on "The Nutcracker," with Sister Mary Leo as the Sugar Plum Fairy, doesn't go quite as well as expected when she is hit in the shin by a student's baton and the nuns have to improvise to entertain the audience. Lots of laughs and surprises and interaction with the cast are yours when you join us for this delightful show.

Nuncrackers will be followed by <u>Sullivan and Gilbert</u>, which is set in the Savoy Theater in 1890. It is the final, frantic day of rehearsal for Gilbert and Sullivan's revue requested by Queen Victoria. The two men have been feuding for years, yet they are forced to work together one more time. The cast of characters include Sullivan's secret girlfriend and Alfred, the son of the Queen, who thinks he belongs on stage. With quick wit and a touching manner, playwright Ken Ludwig's book is adorned with a wonderful Gilbert and Sullivan score. It is a treat for lovers of the Savoyards and everyone who loves the excitement, energy and eccentricities of the theater.

Our season wraps up with <u>Nine</u>. <u>Nine</u>, which was recently seen on Broadway starring Antonio Banderas, Mary Stuart Masterson and Chita Rivera, tells the story of a life out of control. An Italian film director turns forty and faces a double crisis: he has to shoot a film for which he can't write a script, and his wife of twenty years is threatening to leave if he doesn't pay more attention to her and their marriage. Women from his past reappear offering him resolution and love. <u>Nine</u> includes beautifully haunting music by Maury Yeston and book by Arthur Kopit.

PROM THE DIRECTOR



It is senior year for the graduating class of 1959 at Rydell High School and, as in any age, it is all-at-once a frightening world and one full of excitement and promise. Alan Freed has just started broadcasting on WABC in New York. American Bandstand is all the rage! Fidel Castro takes the reins of power in Cuba. The first Barbie Doll makes her debut. Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens, and the Big Bopper are killed in an airplane crash on "the day the music died." It's a time of extreme contrasts. Grease! is a story that shines through all the tumult because it is the thing closest to the human heart; a love story. It's a story about coming of age in a world where no matter what was happening the most important thing for an 18 year old was having friends, being cool, having a car, and worrying about tomorrow when it showed up. It is a story to which we can all relate.

When Grease!, the rock 'n' roll musical written by Jim Jacobs and Warren Casey, was first performed in a Chicago-area barn, it ran almost five hours in length! At the urging of enterprising producers Kenneth Waissman and Maxine Fox, the young, very inexperienced actor-writers trimmed it to a reasonable length and were offered an off-Broadway run. Its premiere was on February 14, 1972 at New York's Eden Theatre. The reviews were less than ecstatic, though audience reaction was decidedly more positive. It was originally directed by Tom Moore and choreographed by Patricia Birch and featured then unknowns, Adrienne Barbeau, Barry Bostwick and Walter Bobbie (director of Broadway's current Chicago). The show caught on like gangbusters and transferred to Broadway's Broadhurst Theatre, and later to the Royale. Though no one could have guessed it at the time, it ran for a record breaking 3,388 performances. It also proved to be a springboard for many Hollywood careers. These included Jeff Conaway, Peter Gallagher, Richard Gere, Rex Smith, Patrick Swayze, John Travolta, and Treat Williams. Thereafter, the 50's-retro musical became a national and international phenomenon that continues even today.




