 Welcome!Our second production of this 79th year of quality musical theatre is a most appropriate show for the season, Nuncrackers. You may think you're sitting in the SLOC Opera House, but really you are in Hoboken, NJ at the Convent of the Little Sisters of Hoboken and Mt. St. Helen's School. If some of you have visited before, you know you are in for a good time. So sit up straight, pay attention and enjoy the fun.

In a recent article in Opera News composer and lyricist Michael John Lachiusa posed the following question: "Is the Musical Dead?" Recent Broadway productions have not followed the "traditional" history of such classics as Oklahoma, West Side Story, or My Fair Lady. These shows and countless others stemmed from an original story or book or was a musicalized version of a well-known play. They had lyrics, music, libretto and choreography all working in equal parts to create the drama. Shows currently on Broadway reflect a new trend of creating a show around a composer or music genre (jukebox musicals), adding music to hit movies, or turning popular animated classics into live-action productions. The writer asserted that these shows were not "real" musicals, thus lending credence to the obituary for the musical, as we know it. One cause for the real musical's near death is economics. "Theatre should be economically accessible as a nice dinner out-not something on which to spend your 401 k ." He concludes that if the "real" musical has gone missing from Broadway, it is alive and well "in the non-profits, in opera houses, in school cafeterias, in basements."

I'd like to think that here at SLOC we try to maintain a little piece of what Mr. Lachuisa refers to as "real" musicals. On a modest budget, in an intimate setting, we produce four shows a season, offering our audiences the opportunity to see older classics, as well as newer works that may not meet the criteria of a "real" musical just to keep up with the times. As a non-profit, we do not "make" a lot of money. Most of our income goes to the upkeep of our building and for the production costs for each show. The only paid people associated with any production are the musicians in our orchestra.

Our show selection committee is currently working on selecting shows for our 80th season. We hope to announce the board's decision early in 2006. The choices are usually numerous and varied. Is the musical dead? We here at SLOC say NO! And you, our audience, must agree, by your very presence here tonight.


SLOC'S 7 OTH SEASON
Our second production of the season is Nuncrackers. This Nunsense Christmas Musical takes place in real time in the basement of Mount Saint Helen's Convent. It is the first TV special being taped in the Cable Access Studio built by Reverend Mother with part of the prize money won earlier by sister Mary Paul/Amnesia. An original ballet based on "The Nutcracker," with Sister Mary Leo as the Sugar Plum Fairy, doesn't go quite as well as expected when she is hit in the shin by a student's baton and the nuns have to improvise to entertain the audience. Lots of laughs and surprises and interaction with the cast are yours when you join us for this delightful show.

Nuncrackers will be followed by Sullivan and Gilbert, which is set in the Savoy Theater in 1890. It is the final, frantic day of rehearsal for Gilbert and Sullivan's revue requested by Queen Victoria. The two men have been feuding for years, yet they are forced to work together one more time. The cast of characters include Sullivan's secret girlfriend and Alfred, the son of the Queen, who thinks he belongs on stage. With quick wit and a touching manner, playwright Ken Ludwig's book is adorned with a wonderful Gilbert and Sullivan score. It is a treat for lovers of the Savoyards and everyone who loves the excitement, energy and eccentricities of the theater.

Our season wraps up with Nine. Nine, which was recently seen on Broadway starring Antonio Banderas, Mary Stuart Masterson and Chita Rivera, tells the story of a life out of control. An Italian film director turns forty and faces a double crisis: he has to shoot a film for which he can't write a script, and his wife of twenty years is threatening to leave if he doesn't pay more attention to her and their marriage. Women from his past reappear offering him resolution and love. Nine includes beautifully haunting music by Maury Yeston and book by Arthur Kopit.
