From the DIRECTOR

Life is ever-changing. This summer the world lost the Weekly World News. The editors of the newspaper shuttered the publication in August. Bat Boy debuted as a cover story of the paper on June 23, 1992. The original front-page photo of Bat Boy, showing a creature with a grotesque screaming face, was the second-best selling issue in the tabloid's history. Since that time, BatBoy has been chased by the FBI, fought in Afghanistan, endorsed Al Gore for president, ran in the California gubernatorial election and was even mistaken for a baseball "batboy" selling steroids in a Little League in Rochester! The website of the paper was filled with "sightings" from all over the world and there was even reports of a child saving his money for plastic surgery (and wigs) to make him look more like Bat Boy. Followers all over the world have raised Bat Boy to cult icon status.

The show itself draws from the *Bat Boy* legend, but the creators add their own spin to the town of Hope Falls, West Virginia, the place where *Bat Boy* was found. The show deals with themes of hypocrisy, acceptance, forgiveness, and racism, but often punctuates the most serious moments with a slap of humor. As you watch the show, you will also notice the abundance of religious symbolism. Religion is juxtaposed against bloody horror aspects of the piece to point out the absurd hypocrisy and lack of tolerance by the townsfolk as the hysteria of the situation grows to epic proportion throughout the show, much akin to the Frankenstein story by Mary Shelley and culminating in a Grand Guignol style ending.

Here in the Capital Region we have suffered our own sudden loss of a theater icon, my partner Colin McCarty. Colin was to join us tonight as the veterinarian, Dr. Parker, but he died suddenly midway into the rehearsal process for the show. Much like the Weekly Word News and Bat Boy, he was taken from us all. I would guess that most of you here tonight have seen Colin on stage in some show or other over the years. He was a gifted comic actor with impeccable timing, but could turn a dramatic role into his own just as easily. Of all his roles here at SLOC, the one he loved the most was playing the Emcee in Cabarer, complete with fishnet stockings and heels, gorilla suit, and diaper as costumes. Colin was looking forward to this role too, eager to work with new cast members in their first SLOC show.

Colin touched the lives of everyone he met – he made people feel at ease and treated everyone with respect and dignity. Many of the cast knew him only a short time but he greeted each with a smile and a pun and always told me on the way home that he felt this cast was one of the most talented he has been part of. Colin lived every moment of life to the fullest, truly never regretting anything. With this said, the cast and crew of *Bat Boy* would like to dedicate these performances to Colin. Like Dr. Parker says when he longs for the touch of his wife:

"Dance with me, darling Won't you embrace me? Kiss me in case we don't meet again,"

I urge you to go home and hug your loved ones, since they may not be there tomorrow.

To Colin - May he and Bat Boy both be in a better place. Enjoy the show.






