

A Letter From The Director

In 1988 director John Waters did something no one would have ever imagined: He made a movie that was rated PG! *Hairspray*. For a director like Waters, this might be the most subversive thing he has done in his entire career. It wasn't until 2002, when *Hairspray* became a musical, that the story would leave behind its roots as a cult classic and become a mainstream smash. The songs include 1960s-style dance music and downtown rhythm and blues. In 1962 Baltimore, plump teenager Tracy Turnblad's dream is to dance on The Corny Collins Show, a local TV dance program based on the real-life Buddy Deane Show. When Tracy



wins a role on the show, she becomes a celebrity overnight. She then launches a campaign to integrate the show. *Hairspray* is a social commentary on the injustices of parts of American society in the 1960's. It's a story that revolves around the successful attempt by white and black Baltimore teens in 1962 to integrate a teen dance show.

As a history major, I've always been interested in the rise of teen dance shows in the late 50's and early 60's that signaled a dramatic cultural shift in musical taste for teens from the big band sound of the 40's to rock and roll. More importantly, teen dance shows introduced black music, musicians and singers to a white audience who were living in an increasingly racially integrated world. This story shows us that reality can overcome us at any time, and we must be prepared to stand tall and strong. The story also invokes an immediately liking when meeting the different characters and discovering their journeys sought within their own little community. Each of us yearns to become something great, and furthermore the story of *Hairspray* allows us to believe in ourselves.

Directing *Hairspray* has been a huge honor and distinction for me for numerous reasons. First, let me start by saying how proud I am of this extremely talented cast, their ability to bring this beautiful and yet funny story to life is simply breathtaking, and yet, significant. Second, my production team couldn't be any more dedicated; working with each of you is truly rewarding, please know you are forever appreciated. Lexi, your passion alone is enough to make anyone proud, and I'm very proud of you; furthermore you will go far! To Janie and Joanne; the two of you have kept me inspired and focused on my goal of being able to tell *Hairspray* successfully, and you simply did it by having faith and belief in me. Thirdly, thank you to the SLOC board for giving me an experience that will essentially outlive me for generations to enjoy.

In closing, I wish to leave you all with a quote that has inspired me in summarizing the true meaning behind *Hairspray*, "You can't stop my happiness, 'cuz I like the way I am. And you just can't stop my knife and fork when I see a Christmas ham! So if you don't like the way I look, well, I just don't give a damn!" – Scott Wittman & Marc Shaiman




