Birth of the Galaxy Campaign

Welcome to the Schenectady Light Opera Company's Gala Benefit Concert! Almost a year ago, a group of SLOC members gathered to address a problem that could cripple performances at the Opera House. The lighting system, an integral part of our productions for over 15 years, had become dilapidated and unreliable. Without replacement, SLOC would be forced to use minimal lighting or rental equipment. Since these eventualities were unacceptable, the group envisioned a campaign to raise the necessary funds to purchase a new and modern lighting system. With the support of the SLOC Board, the "Galaxy of Shining Stars Campaign" was launched at the beginning of the 1993-94 season.

Program inserts and newsletter articles explained the campaign and asked audience, friends, businesses and SLOC members for contributions. The response has been fantastic! With the campaign half over, total contributions exceed \$12,000. In addition, a long-time friend of the Opera Company has offered to "put it over the top" when the total reaches \$16,000. This means only \$4,000 more to reach that goal. With your continued support, we can do it!
