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
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✤ WELCOME TO SLOC ♦

DIRECTOR'S NOTES



Jesus Christ Superstar began its life as a mega-hit rock recording that then went on to become the controversial smash Broadway show of 1971. It was Andrew Lloyd Webber's first Broadway musical and, to many, contains some of his best and most exciting music.

This rock opera tells its story entirely through song. The show focuses on the last seven days of Christ's life. The difference is that we are asked to look at them through the eyes and mind of Judas who is portrayed as a rational Everyman, but who is disturbed and perplexed by the changes he sees in his Leader. He is confused as he perceives that the focus of The Movement is changing from the issues of the day to Jesus himself. It has been referred to as a passion play--Jesus as a victim of his own creation.

Webber and the author, Tim Rice, purposely finished the play at the Crucifixion and Entombment. In their notes, they left the interpretation of the play to future directors, saying that they could only pose, but not answer, questions.

That theme has served as a subtext for our presentation at Schenectady Light Opera Company.

If Jesus had appeared in Schenectady in 1994, rather than in the Palestine of 2,000 years ago, would he be universally embraced?

Perhaps not. That is your judgment to make.

Local audiences have seen his work on stage at the Cohoes Music Hall, NYS Theatre Institute, SUNYA, Russell Sage, SCP, ACT, the Palace and Proctor's. He also appeared in SLOC's *Grease* and *The Boyfriend*.

▶ MICHAEL A. DALE (Judas) appeared as The Leading Player, his favorite SLOC role, during a 1983 production of *Pippin*. Michael also has performed in a number of other SLOC and local community theater productions. He has always wanted to play the role of Judas, and he dedicates his performance to his wife Karen. Michael is employed by the State of New York.

▶ STEPHANIE BELLINGER CLEGHORN (Mary Magdalene) is performing her first lead role with SLOC. She has also been in SLOC's Little Shop of Horrorsas Chiffon and in Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat as Mrs. Potiphar. Elsewhere, she has appeared in the chorus of Sweeney Todd at Russell Sage College, as Irene Malloy in the Amsterdam Park and Recreation's *Hello, Dolly!* and in *Chorus Line* with Colonial Little Theatre in Johnstown. She dedicates her performance in loving memory of her supportive and inspiring aunt, Mary Kokoczka.

▶ HOWARD MOYER (*Caiaphas*) has directed several SLOC shows, including*Little Shop of Horrors*, for which he was the voice of Audrey II. Most recently, he appeared in *The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas* as SheriffEd Earl Dodd. He is a science teacher for Schenectady Schools.

COLIN A. McCARTY (Annas) recently appeared as J. P. Finch in SLOC's How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying. He also has been in SLOC's Cabaret (as the Emcee) and Little Shop of Horrors (as The Dentist). He has performed locally with Family Players, SCT, ACT and ESIPA, and has summer stock credits in NH, MA and MD. CHRISTOPHER TROMBLEY (*Musical Director*) last directed Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat. Since then he has designed sound for Albany Civic's Bent and Schenectady Civic's Look Homeward Angel. He has performed with SLOC (Baby, Pirates of Penzance), Albany Civic Theatre, The Berkshire Opera Co., Saratoga Friends of Musical Arts, and Family Players of Guilderland. He is currently assistant director of Capitol Hill Choral Society and works for John Keal Music Co. in Albany.

CAREN LESSNER (Choreographer) has danced with the NJ Ballet, toured the U.S., Canada and South America as a professional dancer. She has appeared with Tony Roberts in *Play It Again, Sam* and Betsy Palmer in *Life with Father* at the Papermill Playhouse in NJ. Caren regularly performs with her husband, magician Lawrence Lessner. Locally, she has choreographed Cabaret, Fiorello, Anne of Green Gables, West Side Story, Galaxy of Shining Stars Gala Benefit Concert, Barnum, Nunsense II; Promises, Promises and Meet Me in St. Louis. She has also coordinated entertainment revues for corporate events, banquets and theme parks.

MARY ANN CONCRA (Co-Producer) has appeared onstage in SLOC's Fiddler on the Roof and The Wizard of Oz. Backstage, she has worked on makeup and ushering committees for many shows. She has also served as rehearsal secretary. She co-produced How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying last season. 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✤ ABOUT WEBBER & RICE

ANDREW LLOYD WEBBER Music

The small and elf-like Andrew Lloyd Webber has met with success at a relatively young age, having been born in 1948. He was educated at Westminster School where he was a Queen's Scholar, Magdalen College, Oxford and The Royal Court of Music. His first music to be published was a suite for his toy theatre when he was nine.

Mr. Webber is the composer of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat (1968, extended to 1972), Jesus Christ Superstar (1971), Jeeves (1974), Evita (1975), Variations (1978), Tell Me on a Sunday (1979), Cats (1981), Starlight Express (1984), Requiem (1985), The Phantom of the Opera (1986), and Aspects of Love (1989). Variations and Tell Me on a Sunday were combined as Song and Dance in 1982. His film scores include Gumshoe (1971, starring Albert Finney) and The Odessa File (1973).

Mr. Webber's awards include four Tony Awards, four Drama Desk Awards, three Grammys (including the award for Best Classical Contemporary Composition for*Requiem* in 1986), and three "Larrys." In October 1982, he became the first composer to have three musicals--*Cats, Starlight Express* and *Phantom of the Opera--* running simultaneously in both London and New York. When *Phantom* opened in NY in January 1988, the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers saluted Webber with its first Triple Play Award.

He is married to Sarah Brightman; they have two children.

TIM RICE Lyrics

The tall, shambling Mr. Rice was born in Buckinghamshire, England in 1944. He was educated at Lancing College, Sussex and briefly at the Sorbonne in Paris. Rice was later unsuccessful at a legal career in the mid-60s, but he managed to increase the incomes of several lawyers over the next 20 years as a result of his decision to pursue the entertainment business!

He met Andrew Lloyd Webber in 1965. Together they wrote the lyrics to *The Likes of Us* (1966), a musical based on the life of Dr. Bernardo; *Joseph...Dreamcoat* (1967), an operetta for children; *Jesus Christ Superstar* (1969), and *Evita* (1975).

Rice and Webber recently became the first writers to have three musicals playing simultaneously in the West End, when a revival of *Joseph...* joined *Superstar* and *Evita* productions (London's longest-running musical ever).

Mr. Rice is a well-known broadcaster in England, appearing regularly on radio and TV programs, often displaying his vast knowledge of popular music since 1956. He is the winner of two Tonys and a Drama Desk Award for *Evita*.

In 1992 he was co-author of the songs for Disney's *Aladdin*, with Alan Menken and Howard Ashman. In 1993, he co-wrote five Disney's *Beauty and the Beast* songs with Alan Menken.

He is a fanatical, if untalented, cricketer, running his own team in England. He lives in Oxfordshire with his wife Jane and two children.
