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
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
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#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

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
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#### Help, Help, The Globolinks

She gets him to sing "La" and then she leads the little musical army off to find the school bus.

Meanwhile, back at the bus, the children and Tony, the bus driver, are very forlorn and afraid. The Globolinks are becoming more threatening and no longer seem afraid of the bus horn. Just as the Globolinks make one last attack the teachers are heard playing and singing in the distance. The Globolinks disperse in fright and the children are rescued, when everyone realized that Emily is not there. She must be lost.

As the scene shifts to the forest of steel, Emily wanders in still playing her violin, among the shapes and towers. She is so tired she sits down and falls asleep, A Globolink approaches and examines her violin. When he plucks the string he is so frightened by the sound it makes he breaks the instrument. She awakens and realizes she is completely helpless. But just then Dr. Stone rushes in and scares the Globolinks away with his "La" Emily is so grateful, yet doesn't understand why Dr. Stone is acting so strange. His transformation into a Globolink is almost complete and he is dragged away by them. Emily faints. But the teachers and the children arrive and rescue her as the Forest of Steel disappears and the Globolinks vanish.

Moral: In the words of Madam Euterpova, "Unless we keep music in our souls a hand of steel will clasp our hearts and we shall live by clocks and dials of air and sea."


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
