

Who's Who in the Cast

- BILL HICKMAN (Harrison Floy) appeared on stage most recently in the Schenectady Civic Players production of Dames at Sea. The last time he was on the SLOC stage was in the production of Annie Get Your Gun. His role in the latter was similar to the role in this production, in that promotion and con man activities are common to each. Bill's talent is not limited to musicals, however, as he has also appeared in Dracula, Major Babara, and Amphitryon 38. Over the years he has appeared in more than a dozen area theater productions. 
