





WHO'S WHO IN THE CAST

WHO'S WHO IN PRODUCTION

VIRGINIA WARD MILLS (Co-Producer, Set Designer/Set Decorator) has worked with SLOC in many capacities including Co-Producer of Damn Yankees, Set Designer, Set Decorator, Properties Chairperson, and has served on the Board. A graduate of Syracuse University, Ginnie is an exhibiting painter, Secretary of the Oakroom Artists, Travel Representative for AFS, and teaches art at Hillside Elementary School, Niskayuna.

E. ANDREW MILLS (Co-Producer) has had principle roles in eight SLOC shows, and was seen most recently in **Brigadoon**. He was Co-Producer of **Damn Yankees**, and has chaired and served on many committees. Drew received his B.F.A. and M.S. from Syracuse, is President of the Mendelssohn Club of Albany, and Associate Supervisor of Art for the State Education Department.

RON KIDD (Director), is assuming his first directing assignment for SLOC. He has directed shows for seven years for Linton High School's Plaza Players — most recently their production of Godspell. Ron has appeared onstage for SLOC in Once Upon A Mattress, Fantasticks, Godspell, and was most recently Dr. Glass in Carnival. Mu. from Indiana University, he is a Special Music Teacher for the Schenectady Schools.

TOM DELLA SALA (Assistant Director) undertakes this position for the first time for SLOC, but has been Co-Director with and Assistant Director to Ron Kidd for Linton's Plaza Players since 1974. He has been active with SLOC both onstage and off stage. A graduate of the University of Pittsburgh, with an M.A. from SUNY Albany, Tom teaches English and Creative Writing at Linton High. He has Co-Authored two original productions with Ron Kidd, and is currently writing (re-writing, and re-writing) a children's story, a book of poetry and a novel.
