

# **SLOC Seeking Backstage Recruits**

Can Schenectady Light Opera Company, which expanded to a four-show season in 1972

when it found a permanent home on State Street, keep up the pace?

Two "large" shows per season were a cinch for a company with more than 50 years of experience with light opera and musical comedy, but the addition of two "smaller" shows "has stretched our resources to the limit," according to SLOC President Gioia Ottaviano.

Doing four shows each season is beginning to tell. The on-stage people are not a problem, but the expanded schedule is stretching our technical resource personnel in all phases of

production."

Despite the present situation, which Miss Ottaviano calls "serious," SLOC members at a recent meeting decided to continue with four-show-seasons, and hopefully to solve the personnel problem by working harder to recruit production volunteers.

Part of this effort, Gioia explained, will be improved public relations to convince newcomers that it is easy to join light opera, that those without theater skills can learn by

doing, and that "you can have the time of your life working backstage."

Part of light opera's recruitment task, she feels, will be to dispel "myths" such as "it is hard

to join the company" and "you have to be able to sing."

"I have been a producer so often because it is what I can do. I can't run lights and I can't sew, but I'm a good organizer and telephone caller. My talent is knowing who to call."

Part of the current problem of finding sufficient production workers, she noted, is the trend, especially among onstage personnel, to specialize in what they particularly like to do. And now, with more theatrical productions every season, they have the opportunity to specialize.

Increased community, dinner, and professional theatrical activity in the area has also contributed to the "shortage of good directors" and a shortage of available, suitable musical

The former Beth Israel Synagogue at 826 State St. has provided a smaller house for the two additional shows each season, and has brought light opera "stability as a group."

But the two-story, brick building is costly to keep in operation and presents constant maintenance demands.

The all-volunteer light opera organization has a \$50,000 annual operating budget and spends nearly \$11,000 on each of its big shows, and some \$6,000 on the small shows.

She said SLOC continues to "make money on every show, but we don't make money for the year because of fixed costs, such as fuel oil and insurance, which have increased dramatically in just the past several years."

Despite the problems, Miss Ottaviano is convinced that SLOC has "the inside track in this area on large-scale musicals. We made our reputation and image on them, and they are our single area of expertise.

"We've been in business over 50 years I don't know if we can count on 50 more years, but
