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
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
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
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
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## A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

## A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

I remember watching a video of Audra McDonald singing "I'll Be Here" around 8 years ago, and I instantly fell in love with the song. Even now, I still get shivers when I hear it. But at the time, *Ordinary Days* was not on my radar. Not while blockbusters like *Wicked, The Lion King,* and *The Phantom of the Opera* occupied my playlists (I was definitely a millennial theater kid). It wasn't until I recently saw a virtual youth production of the show that my interest was sparked. I streamed the cast recording and was immediately inspired.



There is so much truth in this piece. It captures the ordinary (and sometimes extraordinary) days of New York City life. Whether or not you've experienced life in the Big Apple, you will see yourself in one of these characters trying to navigate everyday life. While the story is portrayed through music, I wanted the cast to embrace the feeling of connecting with another person just through simple conversation. The show is generally performed "cabaret-style" with the characters often on stage alone, but I felt it was important to increase the character's moments together to get a real glimpse into the relationships they form. Many people believe that New Yorkers are distant and unfriendly, focused only on themselves and starved for connections, but in some way, everyone finds a connection amongst the "thousands of tiny specks." It's what makes NYC so special.

I love to look at shows in a new light and create a setting where inspiration and creation can thrive. What better setting than The Metropolitan Museum of Art? Here, it's meant to symbolize the art that is in our everyday, ordinary lives. Artists designed the chair you're sitting in, the light fixture in your living room, and the purse you're carrying – art is all around us.

I want to thank my cast and crew, for they are all true artists. Through thick and thin, we have embraced the opportunity to share this musical with our community and to do what we truly love: create. I hope that you walk away today feeling a connection – to someone you love, to your career, to your life, to anything that brings you joy. From the bottom of my heart, thank you for being here. It is because of you that we can open these doors again and bring you the art that we all cherish. Enjoy this beautiful story of a few *Ordinary Days*.

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


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




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
