We are proud of all we are accomplishing in our small but mighty theater as we make our post-Covid comeback. In July, we produced our first-ever main stage summer show in our Franklin Street home, and it was also our first-ever play. This season, we are bringing back our youth production for the first time since 2019. *Tarzan* rehearsals are underway and the show features students, not only onstage, but helping make the show happen behind the scenes in all production and technical roles. We are



continuing to increase the size and scope of our shows with larger casts and orchestras as they, along with audiences, return to our pre-Covid numbers.

Current projects include work on our building's facade, a project to install new signage to make us a more visible presence in the community, and continued reorganization of our set storage to maximize efficiency. We will also be cleaning up our parking lot area, including leveling the ground and adding in fencing. 

Don't worry about the bits you can't understand. Sit back and allow the words to wash around you, like music. --Roald Dahl, "Matilda"

Have you ever revisited something from childhood and realized it was nothing like you remembered? Everything is like this in some way. We often remember our childhood with rose-colored glasses, we keep the big picture, but we lose so many of the details as time marches on. So much of this process was a reminder of this. Of how so many things aren't the way I remember them, and how much deeper something can be than you realized.



If there's an author that exemplifies this, I suppose it would be Roald Dahl. Famous as a children's author, one would be shocked to find the level of adult themes and concepts within his writing. As I revisited the novel, I was struck by the layers of grief, resentment, abuse, and more that littered the pages of what I remembered as a whimsical tale professing the importance of reading. I think it's important to note that "Matilda" was the last children's book that Dahl would publish in his lifetime. Keeping with his theme of tyrannical adults and heroic children, Matilda is notable in that her obstacles are no longer supernatural witches or man-eating giants, but physical and emotional abuse, neglect, and ignorance. Agatha Trunchbull has long earned her place in the Hall of Villainy, but her list of crimes was far greater than I recalled. Honestly, Mr. and Mrs. Wormwood get too much of a pass.

I wanted this production to exemplify this aspect. To show the brutal reality of what Matilda overcame. How truly remarkable it was that this little girl could stand up against seemingly impossible odds and do the right thing, even when everyone else was telling her how impossible it was. I think this is what has caused Matilda's story to pervade the way it has. It's a story that so many people identify with, for any number of reasons, and celebrates the power of imagination. There is, of course, the simple message of brains over brawn, but more than that, how we overcome the things we can't control to take charge of what we can. This was the most difficult show I've ever directed. Between the large cast and seemingly unending technical challenges we encountered, there were days when we couldn't see the way forward. But I suppose that's what Matilda does. The way she inspires Miss Honey and her classmates to overcome their abuse at the hands of The Trunchbull, so too were we inspired to tell her story. Not the way we remember it, but the way it is.






