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


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A Letter from the President

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A Letter from the Director

"I suppose that a lifetime spent hiding one's erotic truth could have a cumulative renunciatory effect. Sexual shame is in itself a kind of death. What would happen if we spoke the truth?" –Alison Bechdel

When I thought of how to open my director's letter for the program, I knew it had to be a quote from the graphic novel, on which the musical is based: "Fun Home: A Family Tragicomic." When I came across this quote, I knew it perfectly summed up the theme of this heartbreaking, yet stunning true story. This show was not exactly love at first sight for me. I was much younger when it first premiered and at the time I couldn't fully appreciate it. I remember seeing the tour when it came to



Proctors Theater and I sat in the front row. I felt a certain kind of relief as I watched the finale, grateful that I had the courage and support to come out and love who I really was.

Being queer is a superpower that I've now adopted as one of my most outstanding traits, but it wasn't always like that. Growing up as a first generation Italian boy, I didn't always have pride in who I really was; in fact I denied it for a long time. This story shows how dark our lives can become when we deny who we really are and when we let shame guide us rather than pride. There have been many moments when I saw myself in these characters, especially the moments of shame in the show when Medium Alison prays to God, "Please–don't let me be a homosexual." I could have seen my life taking a very different turn had it not been for queer role models and the love and support from my friends and chosen family in the LGBTQIA+ community. This show forces you to think, what happens to those folks who never come out or embrace who they really are? Real people like Bruce Bechdel?

While *Fun Home* may not be the happiest representation of queer storytelling, it's arguably one of the most important queer stories ever told. It reminds us why it's important to have pride in ourselves, and why the word PRIDE is so vital. Alison's life began when she chose to be herself, regardless of the fears and consequences of coming out. Her father Bruce shows us the opposite side of that coin, the way we warp and change, or the way our minds and even sanity can deteriorate when we deny what's really inside.

Fun Home may be a queer-centered story, but you don't have to be queer to identify with it. This story is also a powerful tale about parent/child dynamics and the impact our parents have on us and who we become. It's about first love, self-discovery, family, grief, and, at its core, it's about healing.

This cast and crew are a true dream, and they have poured their hearts and souls into this work. We hope you'll laugh with us, cry with us, and heal with us. I'd like to extend a special shout out to all the queer people who ever had to hide themselves from showing their true colors. This story is for you.



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
