

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
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
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### A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT


Last month, we produced our biggest main stage fundraiser since our re-opening, "SLOC Sings Billy Joel." Most recently, we installed brand new illuminated signage on Franklin Street and Liberty Street with the help of a Schenectady Metroplex grant, as well as new lighting outside our buildings, an important upgrade as we work to provide the safest possible environment for our volunteers and patrons. ### A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

"Through the darkness comes the laughter, All the stars bend over sideways. Oh my darling, there's a Heaven. Such a comet on its way"

For my Director's notes here at Schenectady Light Opera Company, I often choose a quote that I think sums up what I think the show is about, or that represents my overall approach to the show. While this note is no different, I am cheating somewhat. The lyrics above are from a song entitled "Comet On Its Way" that was cut before the show made its Off-Broadway debut in 2006. The song was replaced by "The Bitch of Living" and on the surface, followed the boys as they experience sexual frustration in all its glory. On a deeper level, it is about letting



go and finding a release. It is about a time when you won't always feel this way.

My journey with *Spring Awakening* began in 2006 when I heard the music for the first time. I was 16, and was instantly hooked. I felt as if the songs were written for, and about, me. I finally got to see the show in the summer of 2008. I had just turned 18. I laughed. I cried. I couldn't speak. I immediately felt seen and acknowledged as a person, despite the fact that if you had asked why, I wouldn't have been able to tell you.

Now, of course, I could tell you that what I saw on stage were young people trying to make sense of their own feelings; feelings like loneliness, joy, desire, shame, and every derivative of them imaginable. I now know that feelings like these are common, but when you experience them for the first time, it doesn't always feel that way.

The final song in *Spring Awakening* is called "The Song of Purple Summer." It has always fascinated me because it was written as an epilogue of sorts, and exists outside of the main story. As is with most songs in the show, it is rich with metaphor and symbolic imagery. It tells the story of a mother singing a song to her child about a purple summer, and how all of these magnificent things will happen. As with "Comet," this song is about a time when it won't be like this; the hardships will pass and the days will open up with all the possibilities life has to offer. It is one of my favorite songs in the show; for a similar reason as "Comet" and why I've chosen the quote above. *Spring Awakening* attempts to show that the tragedies that befall the characters are preventable. The cycles of trauma that are passed down from generation to generation can be broken, and if we all work our hardest, one day, we won't need to tell this story anymore. It is a noble cause, and one that it will take all of us to realize. Until then, however, we do our part and sing this story for all to hear. Thank you for being open to hearing it.

SLOC's very own "Piano Man," **Dan Galliher** has been an integral part of our theater community over the years, volunteering his time as a Music Director, pit musician, piano accompanist, and Co-Director of Fundraising. A school music teacher by day, Dan has always been happy to offer help to SLOC, despite how busy his schedule gets. Making his debut as the Music Director of *Seussical* in 2008, he has since gone on to provide music direction to multiple SLOC productions. During the COVID



lockdown, Dan kept everyone's spirits up by providing virtual "Tuesday Night Tunes" on piano each week. This led to a small fundraiser he created to provide some financial relief for SLOC during the pandemic. Once our doors were open again, Dan was quick to assemble a group of talented musicians for "An Evening With Dan & Friends," a benefit concert for SLOC. This has evolved into a signature fundraising event. "SLOC Sings Elton John" and "SLOC Sings Billy Joel" were hugely successful, raising thousands of dollars for SLOC. If it weren't for Dan and his ability to curate an unforgettable concert featuring incredible talent, this success would not have been possible. Whether it's conducting, providing accompaniment for auditions, transcribing music, or simply telling an awful Dad joke to brighten someone's day, Dan is always eager to help others and bring people together. 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
