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
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
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
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A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

With music by rock legend Phil Collins and book by David Henry Hwang, this show is based on the Disney animated musical of the story "Tarzan of the Apes" by Edgar Rice Burroughs, and surrounds the theme of "two worlds, one family."

Tarzan marks the return of our SLOC youth program! This program began in 2011 with our production of *Les Misérables*. It had become a tradition, every fall, to host 9th-12th grade students from area high schools to make up the cast of our annual youth show. We were

forced to put this program on hold during COVID, making this our first student production since *Mary Poppins* in 2019.

We love bringing students from the world of high school into the SLOC family. This year, in addition to the 16-student cast, we have a dozen students working behind the scenes being mentored by our adult production and design staff. We are grateful to director Stephen Foust and his entire production team for creating the opportunity for these students to participate in the arts and to develop skills that they will carry with them into their futures. And we are grateful to you, our patrons, for supporting us and these students as we rebuild this valuable youth program.

As we move closer to Thanksgiving and the holiday season, we ask you to consider making a donation to the theater as part of our Giving Tuesday campaign. 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
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Who's Who in the Cast & Crew
