

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A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

I first encountered *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* in 2004 when I was a freshman in high school. I was cast in the ensemble but when an older castmate dropped out, I was elevated to the role of Bazzard and thrust into the spotlight in a fashion not unlike the character itself. I was immediately struck by how different this material was to anything else I had encountered in my young life. On paper, this show seemed like a terrible idea - full of ingredients that didn't make sense - but practically it all just seemed to work.



This show has been a constant source of joy in my life, and has popped up at various points where I didn't expect it. When the opportunity came up to work on SLOC's 99th season, *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* seemed like the perfect candidate.

While my previous SLOC shows have all dealt with darker themes, I wanted to focus on something a bit more joyful this time around. *The Mystery of Edwin Drood* is not just a musical; it's a party, a puzzle, and a community event all rolled into one. From the very beginning, this show invites the audience to be part of the storytelling. You are not just watching the mystery unfold—you're helping solve it. In that way, *Drood* reminds us that theatre is best when it's shared, messy, and full of opinions.

While the show is full of outrageous characters, questionable morals, and dramatic overreactions, it's also about belonging. Cloisterham is a community that thrives on gossip, secrets, and tradition—much like any town, school, or group of people who gather to tell stories together. Beneath the comedy and chaos is a reminder that community is built through shared experiences, even when those experiences involve a missing nephew and a suspiciously guilty-looking choir master.

So settle in, enjoy the silliness, trust no one completely, and remember: in this theater, the mystery isn't just who did it—it's how we decide, together, what the ending will be.
