



A LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT



Welcome back to SLOC for our 99th Season! After a productive summer that featured a theater festival, a 90's-themed fundraiser, and more improvements to our campus, we're thrilled to officially kick off this season with *Dreamgirls*. Directed by the incomparable Mani Velvet McCalmon, this beautiful show features vibrant storytelling and powerful music that explores themes of sacrifice, struggle, and ambition while educating and celebrating the cultural power of Black artistry. While you may recognize some familiar faces, a majority of this cast is new to the SLOC stage, and I can assure you, their voices will blow you away! *Dreamgirls* is



rarely performed in the Capital Region, and we are grateful to have the opportunity to present it with such an impressive array of talent on stage and behind the scenes! I am so proud of the work this entire team has put into this production, and I know you'll have an amazing time!

As we approach the end of our first century of community theater, we are beginning to lay the groundwork for SLOC's future with some ambitious but important upcoming projects including new and improved ADA accommodations, a brand-new set-building and storage facility, energy-efficient technology, updated seating, and more. Our Centennial Campaign committee has set a goal to raise \$3.5 million toward these improvements.

Assemblyman Angelo Santabarbara and New York State House Speaker Carl E. Heastie visited our campus this summer. After learning of our ADA compliance issues preventing us from casting actors with physical disabilities, a commitment of \$2.5 million was made by New York State toward our Centennial fundraising goal! We are incredibly grateful for Assemblyman Santabarbara's support in securing this funding and for his staunch advocacy for accessibility and the performing arts.

While this funding will give us a great start to implementing these improvements, we will still have \$1 Million more to raise to reach our goal! Despite uncertainties regarding inflation and tariffs, I am optimistic that with the help of our generous donors, supporters, and patrons like you, we will be able to exceed this goal. A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Ten years ago, I stepped into SLOC for the first time as a teenager to audition for *Beauty and the Beast*. That youth program showed me what theater could be like when it becomes a home and served as a reminder to keep coming back whenever theater felt like anything less than one. In the decade since, I have worked in nearly every corner of this theater, from ushering to choreographing, performing, and now directing. But this production is not about my journey. It is about the voices, the stories, and the people who are so often pushed into the margins finally standing center stage where they belong.



Dreamgirls is not just a musical; it's a living testament to Black artists who dreamed in a world that denied them dignity, who fought for recognition when doors were slammed in their faces, and who defined themselves against a system built to erase them. It's a story of survival, love, betrayal, and resilience. It's a reminder of how much was taken, but also of how much could never be taken away. These stories are not easy, but they are vital. They deserve to be heard in every art form.

Too often, local theater neglects to prioritize safe spaces for BIPOC artists. The richness of their voices is overlooked or tokenized. *Dreamgirls* gives SLOC an opportunity to disrupt that and to hold space where artists of color are not an afterthought but are now the very heartbeat of the story. This cast, crew, and community are proof of what can happen when representation goes from optional to essential. They are proof that when we create space, people will step into it and shine.

My deepest gratitude goes to every person who has poured themselves into this production, onstage and off. To my friends and family, thank you for holding me up when I could not stand on my own.

And finally, to my mother: Thank you for always setting the example. When the world told me to shut up, you told me to yell louder. This show and the chance it has given to speak loudly through art, it is yours as much as it is mine. This one is for you.
